### **Description**

This report highlights a series of online trainings and events organised by the Memory Futures project consortium, in partnership with Limmud Europe, aimed at fostering community engagement, resilience, and effective practices among Jewish volunteers and event organizers. The events spanned various topics, including presentation skills, volunteer engagement, financial management, and exploring Jewish identity in the Mediterranean.

At the heart of this series was the Limmud value of **Participation**—the belief that everyone has something to contribute and something to learn. These events provided inclusive spaces where volunteers and community members were not only trained and supported, but also invited to share knowledge, express diverse perspectives, and take active roles in shaping Jewish communal life across Europe. In doing so, the series contributed to a broader culture of shared responsibility, reflective learning, and democratic engagement within and beyond the Jewish community.

# A series of online trainings:

# 1. How to Give Amazing Online Presentations

Date: November 24, 2022

Facilitator: Joe Hyman, Director of Innovation and Engagement
This interactive workshop focused on equipping participants with the skills necessary to
create and deliver compelling online presentations. Joe Hyman shared innovative techniques
for engaging virtual audiences, utilizing multimedia tools effectively, and crafting narratives
that resonate. Participants engaged in practical exercises, receiving feedback to enhance
their presentation styles, leading to more impactful and memorable online interactions.

2. Voices of Resilience Date: November 27, 2023 Facilitator: Zsuzsa Fritz, Educator and Community Activist

This secure online gathering provided a supportive space for Limmud volunteers in Europe to discuss the challenges posed by the Israel-Hamas war and rising tensions in various communities. The event encouraged candid conversations, allowing participants to share insights, strategies, and best practices for maintaining safety and inclusivity during events. Attendees expressed appreciation for the forum's solidarity, emphasizing the importance of community support in navigating these complex issues.

#### 3. Networking and Training on Effective Presentations

Date: December 19, 2023

Facilitators: Magda Rubenfeld and Peter Neuman

In preparation for the Limmud Festival in the UK, this online meeting was created for European presenters and focused on networking among volunteers and training for effective presentation techniques. Participants had the opportunity to share their experiences and learn from seasoned presenters, fostering collaboration and enhancing the quality of future events. The session emphasized the importance of community engagement in developing impactful presentations that resonate with diverse audiences.

## 4. People Power: Engaging Volunteers for Impactful Events

Date: March 27, 2024

Facilitator: Misha Beshkin, Advocate for Community Empowerment
This interactive webinar explored strategies for recruiting, retaining, and motivating
volunteers within the Limmud community. Misha Beshkin provided valuable insights into
creating an engaging volunteer environment that fosters long-term commitment. Participants
left with actionable techniques for enhancing volunteer involvement, leading to more dynamic
and successful events.

#### 5. Money Matters

Date: June 17, 2024

Facilitator: Dennis Baderoff, Treasurer of Limmud Stockholm

This webinar focused on the essentials of financial management for events, covering budget creation, grant management, and ensuring transparency in financial dealings. Participants learned about the "baking a Limmud cake" analogy, emphasizing the meticulous planning needed for successful event budgeting. The session equipped attendees with tools to manage financial aspects confidently, ensuring sustainability and accountability in their organizations.

The final event Limmud Med highlighted an important and often overlooked aspect of European Jewish identity: the Sephardi identity.

Limmud Med: The Jewish Identity in the Mediterranean

Date: June 18-20, 2024

Overview:

Limmud Med provided an immersive experience into the diverse Jewish identities within the Mediterranean. Participants engaged with documentaries and discussions on topics ranging from Sephardic heritage preservation to the cultural narratives of Jewish communities. Experts facilitated dialogues, enriching participants' understanding of the historical and contemporary significance of Jewish life in the Mediterranean region.

- Session 3: Documental: Mujeres hebraístas, Mujeres de Sefarad (Ricardo Muñoz Solla)

#### **Day 3: Oral Histories and Contemporary Narratives**

- Session 1: Jewish of the Middle East & North Africa: An Oral History (Rabbi Elhanan Miller)
- Session 2: Turkey Rooted Jews in Israel: From Kayades to Avlaremoz (Adem Muzaffer Erol, Jaimie Luria)

These online events have strengthened the community of European Limmud volunteers by providing critical resources, fostering open dialogue, and enhancing the skills of volunteers and event organizers. The feedback from participants highlights the value of these sessions in navigating current challenges and promoting resilience within the community. Moving forward, Memory Futures partners and Limmud Europe aims to continue offering supportive and engaging platforms for learning and collaboration.

They also served as a reminder of the importance of transnational learning and solidarity in confronting shared historical legacies and present-day challenges. By creating spaces where diverse communities could explore identity, memory, and belonging together, the events helped build the foundations for a more reflective and democratic European civic culture.
