## Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

Oresunds Limmud 2023 was the first in-person Limmud in Denmark after the pandemic. 114 participants from 4 countries gathered in Copenhagen to learn about, teach and celebrate Jewish life. Oresunds Limmud serves a diverse audience and with a tri-lingual programme - providing sessions in Danish, Swedish and English. It creates a gathering space for the participants from Denmark, Sweden and beyond.

Within the Memory Futures track, the programme focused on present and historical topics discussed across Europe. Highlights were presentations and topics that captivated our communities across Europe:

- Izzy Posen's sessions: A Cultural Renaissance? New Chassidic Music Trends and My journey from Chassidic community to university and secular life
- Jair Melchior's session: The proposed judicial revolution in Israel
- Simon Kratholm Ankjærgaard's session: October 1943: The escape and captivity of the Danish Jews

The program was also conceptualized with the broader objective of the value of thinking about social cohesion, intercultural dialogue and building inclusive communities in Europe. To that end some of the featured sessions included:

- Road to Recovery Israeli volunteers driving sick Palestinians from the borders to the Israeli hospitals
- My journey from Chassidic community to university and secular life
- At leve som jøde i Ukraine (Living as a Jew in Ukraine)
